**Paige Malin Donohoe -- 1988
Central Bucks West**

During her Central Bucks West High School athletic career, Paige (Malin) Donohoe competed in three sports, Field Hockey, Swimming and Lacrosse, earning six Varsity letters.

Swimming

This was Paige's dominant sport where she earned two letters and as a Senior, was selected Team Captain, excelling in the 100 Yard Breaststroke.

- 200 Yard Individual Medley.
- Breaststroke Leg of 200 Yard Medley Relay.
- Honorable Mention All Suburban One Team her junior year and Second Team Honors All Suburban One Team her senior year in swimming.
- At the 1985 District I Championships, Paige placed 5th in the 100 Yard Breaststroke and 7th place as a member of the 200 medley relay in 1985. That same season, she qualified and competed at the PIAA State Championships, placing 16th in the 100 Breaststroke. The 200 Medley Relay Team also competed at this meet.
- Broke the school record for the 100 Yard Breaststroke.
- Received Coach's Award and Most Valuable Swimmer Award.
- Honorable Mention All Suburban One Team, Junior year.
- Second Team Honors All Suburban One Team, Senior year.

Lacrosse

Paige earned two letters in Lacrosse, elected Captain in her Senior year.

Field Hockey

Paige earned two letters and was a Key Forward on the Varsity team. Paige was selected Captain in her Senior Year and was known to pick up her team with her scoring ability. Paige scored the winning goal in the East /West game her Senior Year.

Paige attended Susquehanna University. She graduated in 1992 with a degree in Business Administration with an emphasis in Marketing and a minor in Speech Communications. She also competed in Field Hockey, Swimming and Lacrosse at the Division III Collegiate level and earned eleven Varsity Letters.

- Four year starter as Attack Wing on Field Hockey.
- Three year starter on offense in Lacrosse which was a club team in her Freshman year.
- Four year starter in swimming and held school records in the 100 yard and 200 yard breaststroke.

The swimming team holds records in the 200 Yard and 400 Yard Medley Relays. In her senior year, Paige was named the Outstanding Senior Women's Scholar Athlete. Susquehanna University inducted her into their 2002 Athletic Hall of Fame.

While pursuing her Master's of Education in Health and Physical Education at East Stroudsburg University, she worked as a Graduate Assistant in the Athletic Training Department. Since graduate school, over the course of 25 years Paige continued in the field of Sports Sports Medicine as the Head Certified Athletic Trainer at Montoursville High School; Assistant Athletic Trainer at Gordon College and at Wellesley College; and the Head Athletic Trainer at Endicott College. After her marriage to Mark Donohoe, she was employed for Chattanooga Group as the New England Territory Manager and Sales Representative promoting medical and rehabilitation equipment. Most recently, she has been an educator at the Tara Montessori School.

Paige and husband Mark currently live in Manchester-by-the-Sea, Massachusetts along with their four children, Luke (12), Cecilia (11), James (9), and Clara (7). Paige and Mark hope their children continue to develop a love of athletics as they grow older. Despite being busy with the children's sports schedules, Paige is active in their community as a volunteer youth assistant coach in Scouting and at Sacred Heart Church. In her free time, she enjoys knitting, baking, cooking, and visiting family and friends.

Paige is honored to be inducted into the Central Bucks Hall of Fame, and is grateful for the support that she received from her family, especially her mother, Cia Malin, twin sister Anne, and brother Matt, as well as her teammates, and coaches throughout her athletic career.
