**R. Bryan Hoff -- 1974 (deceased)
Central Bucks West**

Bryan earned 3 Varsity letters as a 3-year starting Offensive Guard on West Football teams and 4 Varsity letters as a standout Bucks wrestler. He was one of the very first Central Bucks athletes in any sport to earn a Varsity letter while still in 9th grade (Tamanend).

Football

- 3 year Varsity starter and standout lineman on two undefeated Bux-Mont Championship squads ('71 and '72)
- Earned All Intelligencer accolades 3 straight years ('71-'73)
- Honored as All Bux-Mont in both Junior and Senior years ('72-'73).

Wrestling

- 4 year Varsity starter.
- Placed in multiple District Championships, as well as winning a Sectional Championship in 1973 and 3rd place in 1974.
- Selected as Captain in both his Junior and Senior years earning the distinction of being the rare multi-year Buck Captain.
- At the end of his career, Bryan graduated as West's career leader in wins.
- Winner of the 1974 Stanley H. MacFarlane Award as Central Bucks West's Outstanding Male Athlete.

After graduation, Bryan dedicated a great deal of time and energy coaching and mentoring young area wrestlers. Many of these youngsters continued successful wrestling careers in junior high, at West, other area high schools and in college. Being in a position to "give back" to those who followed him at Warrington AA and Tamanend was very important to Bryan.

Bryan died at the young age of 49 in 2005. Since that time his parents, Russ and Ellen, his brother Jerry, and Coach Pettine have also passed away. All were loved, respected and instrumental in the person and athlete Bryan became. This honor is treasured by his brothers, teammates and many friends who can attest to his worthiness of being included among the very best athletes to proudly wear the Black & Gold.
