Karen first set foot on a C.B. West Lacrosse field as a ninth grader where she went on to earn three Varsity letters. Her other competitive sport was Field Hockey earning her two Varsity letters. For both sports she played on championship level teams. And for both sports she was elected their Captain in her Senior year.

Lacrosse

Playing the position of Center, Karen was selected to the First Team All Bux-Mont League in her Junior and Senior years. As a Senior she scored 79 goals and was awarded the team's MVP. Other awards and recognitions:

- Named Player of the Week by :Philadelphia Inquirer in May 1986
- Received All America Honors from USWLA as a Junior and First Team All America Honors as a Senior
- In 1986 selectred to play on the PSWLA Senior All Star Team

Field Hockey

In her Junior year Karen was a member of the undefeated Varsity Bux-Mont League Champions. She was named the Most Improved Player and was selected to the All Bux-Mont League team as its Midfielder. In her Senior year she was awarded Most Valuable Player and selected to the All Bux-Mont League Team having scored 25 goals in that season. During CB West's 3-0 win over CB East Karen scored a hat trick for the District Championship.

Karen received a four year athletic scholarship to Temple University, where she earned four varsity letters in both Field Hockey and Lacrosse.

In each of her four years at Temple she played in the NCAA Division I Final Four Lacrosse Tournament games. In her second year at Temple they were National Division I Lacrosse champions. Karen was named to the U.S. Women's Lacrosse Squad and played in their National Tournament. She also received All America honors from USWLA and won Best Attack Player. She scored 25 goals that season and was selected to the Lacrosse All America First Team.

During Karen's Junior year at Temple she was named Field Hockey Defensive Player of the Year. When the team played in the Atlantic 10 championships, she was named an A-10 All Tournament Player. Karen was selected Captain for the Varsity Field Hockey Team in her Senior Year.

After her graduation at Temple, Ursinus College selected her to become the Head Coach for their Varsity Lacrosse Team. Although she had no prior coaching experience, she coached the team to a second place finish in the NCAA Division III National Lacrosse Championship Tournament.

Karen and her husband Ralph live in Yorktown, VA with their son, Cody and their dog Sam. She has chosen to stay at home to raise their son while working part time as a physical therapy assistant. She enjoys camping, hiking, and going to the beach.
