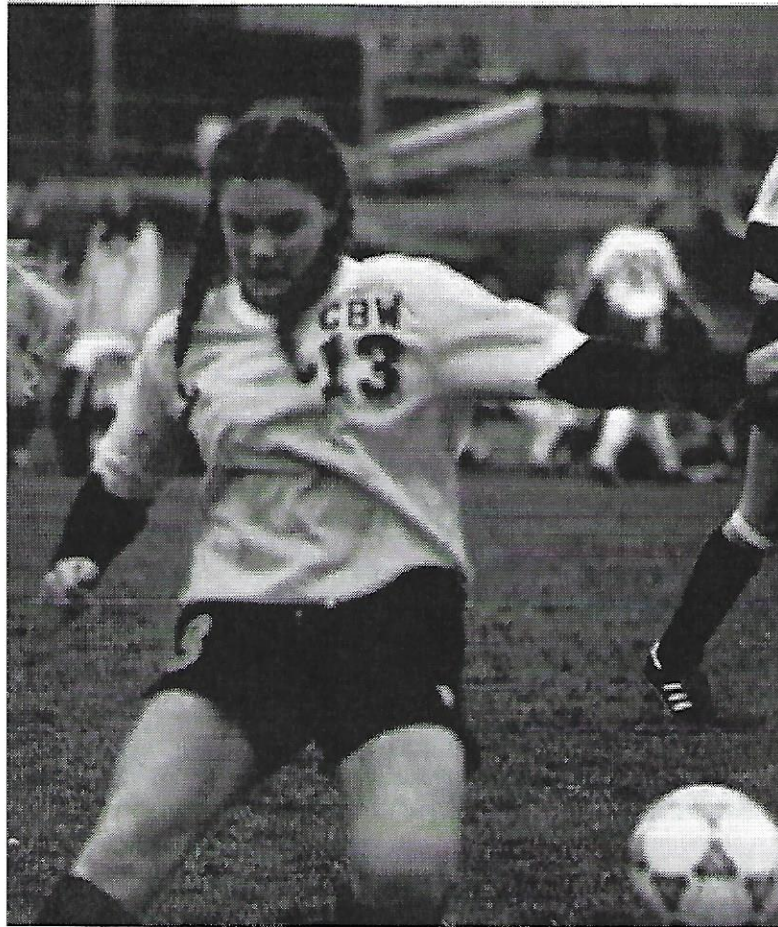

Staca Urie Shehan earned 10 Varsity letters in Soccer, Volleyball and Basketball. She was a member of the 1993, 1994 and 1995 Suburban One League, District 1 and State Championship Soccer Teams. USA Today ranked the CB West Girls Soccer team 8<sup>th</sup> in the Nation in 1993. In her Senior year Staca received the H. Ralph Michener Coaches Award for earning 10 varsity letters in three different sports.

**Volleyball**

In the position of Setter, Staca earned four varsity letters and was elected Captain in her Junior and Senior years. She helped lead the team to the Suburban One League Championship in 1993 and 1994. During her Senior year alone she notched more than 1,000 sets.

## **Soccer**

## **Basketball**

Staca earned two Varsity letters playing the position of Guard and received the Coaches Award during her Sophomore and Junior years.

Upon graduating from high school Staca was selected as the Knights of the Golden Eagles Scholarship Recipient for 1995-1999.

Staca was also awarded athletic and academic scholarships to LaSalle, a Division 1 University in Philadelphia, PA where she was a four-year starter in Soccer. She was Captain in her Junior and Senior years while achieving a 3.8 GPA and graduating Magna Cum Laude with a degree in Psychology and Criminal Justice.

For the past 17 years she has built a career at the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children. As the Executive Director of the Case Analysis Division, she provides analytical support and resources to law enforcement: Assisting them with recovering missing or abducted children; Tracking attempted abductions of children including the location and recovery of victims of child sex trafficking; Identification of child sex traffickers; and Location of noncompliant convicted sex offenders.

Staca and her husband, John live in Alexandria, VA. They enjoy an active lifestyle that includes traveling, camping, hiking, kayaking and playing with their beloved dog Sampson.
