After graduation Wendy attended Lafayette College on a 4-Year scholarship for Field Hockey. She became the team's High Scorer and was selected to the East Coast Conference All Star Team in her Sophomore, Junior and Senior years. In her last year at Lafayette she was selected Captain to her team and again Captain to the East Coast All Star Team. Playing in Field Hockey's East Coast Conference Division, the team was a runner up and then champs in their second year.

Wendy received the Charles L. Albert Award for Top Female Athlete and was the first female athlete to be selected to an East Coast Conference All Star Team for three consecutive years. Wendy graduated in 1986 with a Degree in Psychology. She continued to play Intramural Field Hockey in Pennsylvania for several years before moving out of state.

When learning she was nominated, Wendy was honored with her selection. "I was shocked since there were other players who held key roles in both Softball and Field Hockey and other sports who had excellent stats and contributions. Without my team mates I would never have been as successful as I was."
