

**Bill Tesno -- 1971
Central Bucks West**

Bill Tesno earned three Varsity letters for his participation in Football and Track. A separate sport, not affiliated with West's athletic program, involved *Shotokan Karate*. During his Junior and Senior years Bill studied the martial arts, training under the tutelage of Art Davis where he eventually earned his Black Belt.

Football

Bill's Varsity letter was awarded in his Senior year playing the positions of Wide Receiver, Defensive Halfback and Punter. Additional recognitions:

- Selection on 1st Team All County and 2nd Team All Bux-Mont League.
- Honorable Mention for Bulletin and the All-Scholastic Team.
- 70 total points scored in ten games, including 3 points after touchdown.
- Top Ten list of 19 receptions in a single season for 604 yards, 31.8 yards per catch.

Track

Bill earned two Varsity letters in his Junior and Senior years competing in the 440 and 880 Relay Teams and the Long and Triple Jump.

- Selected Captain in his Senior year.
- Placed 1st in the Long Jump; setting a record of 49'9" in the Triple Jump.
- Ran anchor in the 880 Relay that recorded a winning time of 1:34.1.
- 2nd place in the 440 Relay with a time of 45.3 seconds.

Following graduation Bill attended Wesley Jr. College in Dover, Delaware where he played football as a Safety, lettering for two years. He finished his education at Tennessee Tech University in Cookeville Tennessee, majoring in Education. For two years on the Varsity Football team, he played Safety holding for extra points and field goals. In his Senior year the team won the Ohio Valley Conference Championship.

Returning to the Doylestown area after college, for the next sixteen years, Bill was an Assistant Coach on CB West's Football staff under Head Coach Mike Pettine (2000 CBHOF Inductee). Responsible for coaching the Offensive and Defensive teams, his tenure occurred during the three years when the Football team earned State Championships in 1997, 1998 and 1999 where he coached a variety of Offensive and Defensive positions (the three teams were inducted at the 2017 CBHOF Ceremony)

For the past 35 years Bill has been employed at Cherokee Construction where he currently serves as their Vice-president of Construction. He and his wife Lisa live in Chalfont. Together they have four children—Jennifer, Michael, Nicole, Andrew, and eight grandchildren.
