**Megan Antonucci Trautz “NOOCH”
Central Bucks West -- 2000**

Megan (Antonucci) Trautz was a 3-sport Varsity athlete during her career at Central Bucks West. She received varsity letters in Tennis, Indoor Track and Softball for each of her 3 years, and during her Junior year she earned a Varsity letter for Outdoor Track. In 2000 Megan was named Top Female Athlete and obtained the first Mike Pettine Scholarship.

Tennis

In her Sophomore year Megan climbed the Team ladder beginning at 3rd Doubles. In her Junior year she competed in 4th Singles and moved to 1st Singles when a Senior. Named Captain her Senior year, Megan won the Suburban One League Colonial Division Singles Tournament.

Softball

Selected Captain in her Senior year, Megan's performance at 1st Base earned her numerous awards. The team went on to win the Suburban League Colonial Championship in their Sophomore, Junior and Senior years. They qualified for the District One State Playoffs those same three years, becoming runner-up in her Senior year.

- Statistics after 3 years and 222 times at bat produced a .387 Batting Average.

Indoor Track

Megan competed all 3 years in high jump and the 4x200 relay race. During her Junior year, she placed 1st in the High Jump at the State Invitational with a personal best of 5'0".

After graduation Megan earned a Softball scholarship to Rutgers University's main campus in New Brunswick, NJ, where she played Division 1 Softball as a first baseman. She lettered all 4 years as a starter and earned a spot on the Big East All Rookie Team and the Rutgers University All Rookie Team in 2001, the year when she recorded the most RBI's. Megan earned a position on the Big East Academic Team in 2001, 2003 and 2004. In 2004--her senior year she received the Targum Athlete of the Week. Also, two different times she received the Big East Player of the Week. Megan graduated with a degree in Exercise Science and Sports Studies/Sports Management.

For several years after college Megan played for the NY Sharks – a professional Women's Tackle Football team, as their Punter and Place Kicker. She also continues to play softball in a slow pitch and modified league.

Megan resides in Wayne, NJ with her wife Lynn and their 3 children (Madison, Kiko and Ally).
