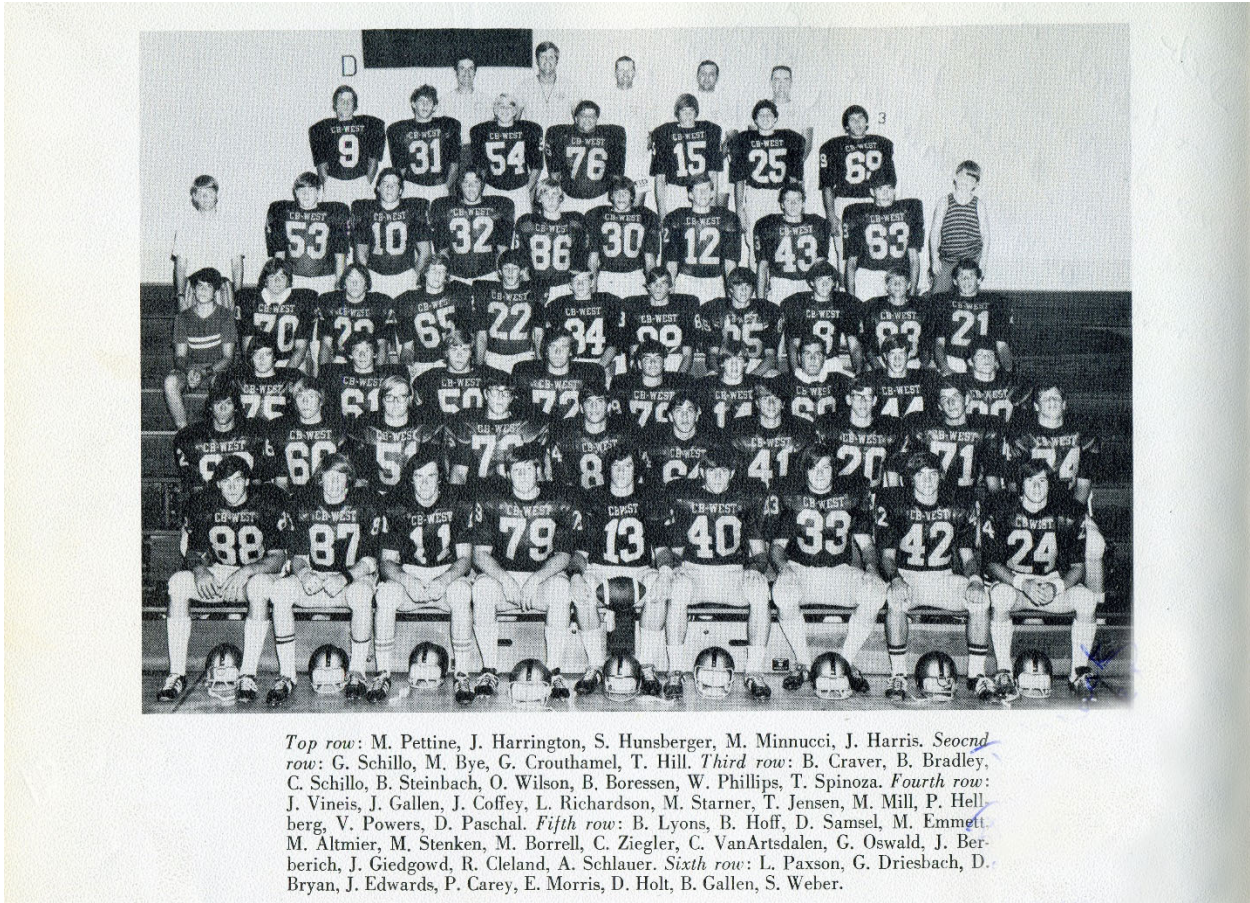

**1972 Central Bucks West  
Bux-Mont Championship Football Team  
Wins 10 Losses 0**

For this fifth year of Pettine's reign, sixteen Varsity players returned, leading the team to the Bux-Mont Football Championship. In a newspaper interview, Coach Mike Pettine remarked, "For the first time since the split (CB West and CB East) we have the depth ... we are two and three deep in some positions ...". Duff and Guydon are gone but Bill Gallen, a 5'8", 155-pound Halfback did not disappoint in his first game at CBW.

**Game One: CB West 28 -- Council Rock 6**

Gallen brought three TD runs to the score board. The first score came from a Pat Carey pass to Dusty Bryan with 3:39 left in the first quarter. CBW held CR to 135 Yards against 239 yards.

**Game Two: CB West 31 -- Quakertown 14**

*Best Single Game Efforts: 145 Yards gained against Quakertown ~ Bill Gallen*

**Game Three: CB West 46 -- Souderton 20**

*Best Single Game Efforts: 175 Yds, 4 TDs ~ Pat Carey 46 ~ Most Team Total Points*

**Game Four: CB West 34 -- Perkiomen Valley 0**

Still undefeated, all 34 points were earned in the first half. On an offensive drive of 60 yards Craig Schillo runs 25 yds for first TD. At 5:40 in the first quarter, Pat Carey tosses 79 yards to Dusty Bryan for TD. Four minutes later, a 50-yard drive takes Dennis Holt over the 2-yard line for TD #3. In the second quarter, 49 yard - 9 play drive, Steve Weber takes it in for TD #4 from the 25. Still in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half, with 3:30 left, Pat Carey tosses a second time to Dusty Bryan for a 79-yard TD. The rains came and turned the field into mud.

**Game Five: CB West 28 -- Wissahickon 22**

*Best Single Game Efforts: Most First Downs - 18; Most First Downs Rushing - 14*

**Game Six: CB West 22 -- Hatboro Horsham 15**

*Best Single Game Effort: Longest Punt Average ~ 3 for 41 yards*

**Game Seven: CB West 28 -- Pennridge 14**

*Best Single Game Effort: Most First Downs - 19*

**Game Eight: CB West 34 -- Upper Perkiomen 14**

First TD, after Upper Perk fumbled, Dennis Holt carried over 2-yard line. Holt scored TD. West got buried in Upper Perk territory until Bill Gallen intercepted a Tom Cashatt pass. There was pressure on West most of first half. In third quarter another fumble recovered by Jeff Gallen on West 42, an 11 - play march put Dennis Holt over on the 1-yard line.

A third and final turnover picked off an UP Cashatt pass which led to a Pat Carey pass to Guy Driesbach for 21 yards; and 8 plays later, Dennis Holt TD from the 2-yard line. Upper Perk scored two TDs but West came back with a handoff from Pat Carey to Bill Gallen to Steve Weber, a pitch back to Carey and a beautiful pass to Guy Driesbach for a 47-yard final TD.

### **Game Nine: CB West 24 -- North Penn 6**

An article by Dick Shearer, Coach Pettine remarked, "This has to be the most businesslike football team I've ever coached." Pettine described their "Proud Accomplishments" and "Their goal now is to go Undefeated!" Near halftime with less than a minute left, Pat Carey's 29-yard pass to Dusty Bryan changed the score to 8-0. North Penn failed on their decision to go for a first on their fourth and one on their own 32. West took over and two plays later Dusty Bryan carried the ball around the end zone. Dennis Holt brought home the two-point conversion. Sustained drives burned up most of the second half. A 21-play, eight-minute march covering 87 yards ended with Dennis Holt carrying the ball into the end zone from the three-yard line. With 9:04 left in the fourth quarter, NP put 6 on the board. Then, a march down the field of 86 minutes was highlighted by Pat Carey's passing and the runs of Dennis Holt and Bill Gallen. (152 yds of West's 195 yds rushing) With 2:31 remaining, Dennis Holt ran through the middle for the final score.

### **Game Ten: CB West 34 -- CB East 6**

Winning their 21<sup>st</sup> game in a row, CB West rolled past CB East. Denny Holt had 3 TD runs, Pat Carey 2 TD passes to Guy Driesbach and Dusty Bryan, Defensively Bill Bradley's fumble recovery and Joe Giedgowd's interception thwarted any Offense by CB East. Players lifted Coach Pettine on their shoulders marking their complete undefeated season. Excerpts from an undated article, Post Game Ten, about Mike Pettine, written by Charley Myers...

*Pettine figures there was a good reason why the Bucks made it look easier this year.*

*"I think we worked harder," he said. "One of the kids came to me at the beginning of the season and said "This year the seniors really want to do it! We had the balance . . . This club had more good athletes than I've ever coached!"*

## Outstanding Individual and Team Efforts of the 1972 Season

Winners of the Bux-Mont League Championship for the second straight season with an Undefeated 21-0 Record.

Season stats include 329 TDs scored against 104 combined TDs of the other nine Bux-Mont Football Teams, ranking West in the Top 20 Teams by WFIL.

CB West ended the season in Sixth Place All Area by the Philadelphia Inquirer.

Pat Carey and Ed Morris received Honorable Mention on the All-State Scholastic Team.

Bill Gallen scored six consecutive touchdowns consisting of the last three in the Council Rock Game and the first three in the Quakertown Game.

Dusty Bryan ran a kickoff back for 90 yards and a Touchdown against Souderton.

Pat Carey passed to Guy Driesbach for three consecutive TD's against Souderton. In the fourth quarter against Pennridge, the CB West Team had possession for 7:56 of the quarter. Pennridge had the ball for 3 plays; 1 running play which lost 1 yard and 2 pass interceptions.
