**Jeff Trauger
Central Bucks West 1980**

Jeff Trauger began his 3-year Varsity Football career with Central Bucks West as a Defensive Tackle and later in midseason, a starting Offensive Tackle. In his Sophomore year, the team recorded a 10-1 season earning the 1977 Bux-Mont Championship. During Jeff's Junior year he competed as a two-way starter at Offensive Guard and Defensive Tackle resulting in an 11-0 season, and Pennsylvania coaches voting them the State's Champions. In his Senior year Jeff and Ivan Lesnick (2006 CBW Hall of Fame Inductee) were elected Co-Captains of the 1979 team, a team that finished 9-1-1.

In 1979, for the first time, the annual East-West Thanksgiving Day Football Game was played for the Bux-Mont Championship before approximately 8,000 fans at Delaware Valley College Stadium.

Jeff received a nomination to play football at the United States Military Academy West Point and was recruited by other Division I Programs, including numerous Ivy League schools.

In 1980, Jeff was selected to the Big 33 East-West Classic as Offensive Guard. He chose Brown University where he was a three-year letterman and a two-year starter. In 1983, Jeff was an Academic All-American, 2nd Team Offensive Guard.

Following graduation from Brown, Jeff pursued his Juris Doctor Degree from Temple University School of Law. From 1987 through 2016, Jeff was employed at the law firm of Grim, Biehn and Thatcher in Perkasié, Pennsylvania, before elevated to CEO from 2001-2011.

In July 2016, Jeff was nominated and confirmed to serve an open position on the Bucks County Court of Common Pleas. The following year, having been cross-endorsed by both political parties, he was elected to serve a ten-year term in the Bucks County Civil Orphans' and Criminal Court Divisions. Jeff and his wife, Colleen, and their two daughters, Rachel and Rebecca, reside in Bucks County.
