Michael earned three Football Varsity letters as a starting Offensive Lineman for the 1992, 1993 and 1994 Central Bucks West High School football teams. In 1994, the team rushed for over 200 yards in all but one game. During his time at West, the teams were 33-4, winning three Suburban One titles, one Eastern Pennsylvania title and finishing as the runner up at the State Championship game.

Michael went on to attend the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill on a full football scholarship. He graduated in 2000 with a degree in Exercise and Sports Science. At UNC, he played four years as an Offensive Lineman, starting in 24 games, 11 in his senior season. He also played in two Gator Bowls and the Las Vegas Bowl. In the 1997, 1998 and 1999 seasons, he saw action in 1,618 plays culminating with UNC's record of 33-16 after four seasons and finishing #4 in the country.

Michael works in the talent acquisition field and lives in Furlong, PA with his wife Nancy and their two sons, Jack and Tommy. The family is active in the Central Bucks community, where they work and volunteer. Their two sons attend schools in Central Bucks and play on local sports' teams. Michael proudly serves as a Board Member of The JAG Fund, a non-profit that raises funds and increases awareness for brain tumor research, established in 1989 in memory of Joel A. Gingras, Jr., a Doylestown legend.
