Central Bucks West

Diane was a 4-Sport participant who received 7 varsity letters during her Central Bucks West High School athletic career.

Tennis

During her 3 years of varsity Tennis, Diane earned Honorable Mention All Suburban One Honors for Doubles in her Sophomore year and for Singles her Junior year. As a Senior, she was Team Captain, voted Most Improved Player, received 2nd Team All Suburban One Honors for Singles and finished the season at 2nd Singles with a 9-3 record.

Basketball

Diane played 3 years of Basketball, earning a varsity letter in her Junior and Senior year on teams that were back-to-back Suburban One League Colonial Division Champions. She was a starting Forward in her Senior year and was named team Captain. As a small 5'6" Forward, Diane averaged 8.6 points and 6 rebounds a game. She earned 1st Team All Suburban One Honors and was given the "Unsung Hero Award" her Senior year. She participated in the William Penn Classic All-Star Game and was the recipient of the William Penn Classic Sportsmanship Award.

Softball

Diane earned a varsity letter and Honorable Mention All Suburban One honors for Softball as a Starting 1st Baseman her Junior year.

In Track and Field, Diane earned a varsity letter and All Suburban One 2nd Team Honors for Javelin in her Senior year.
