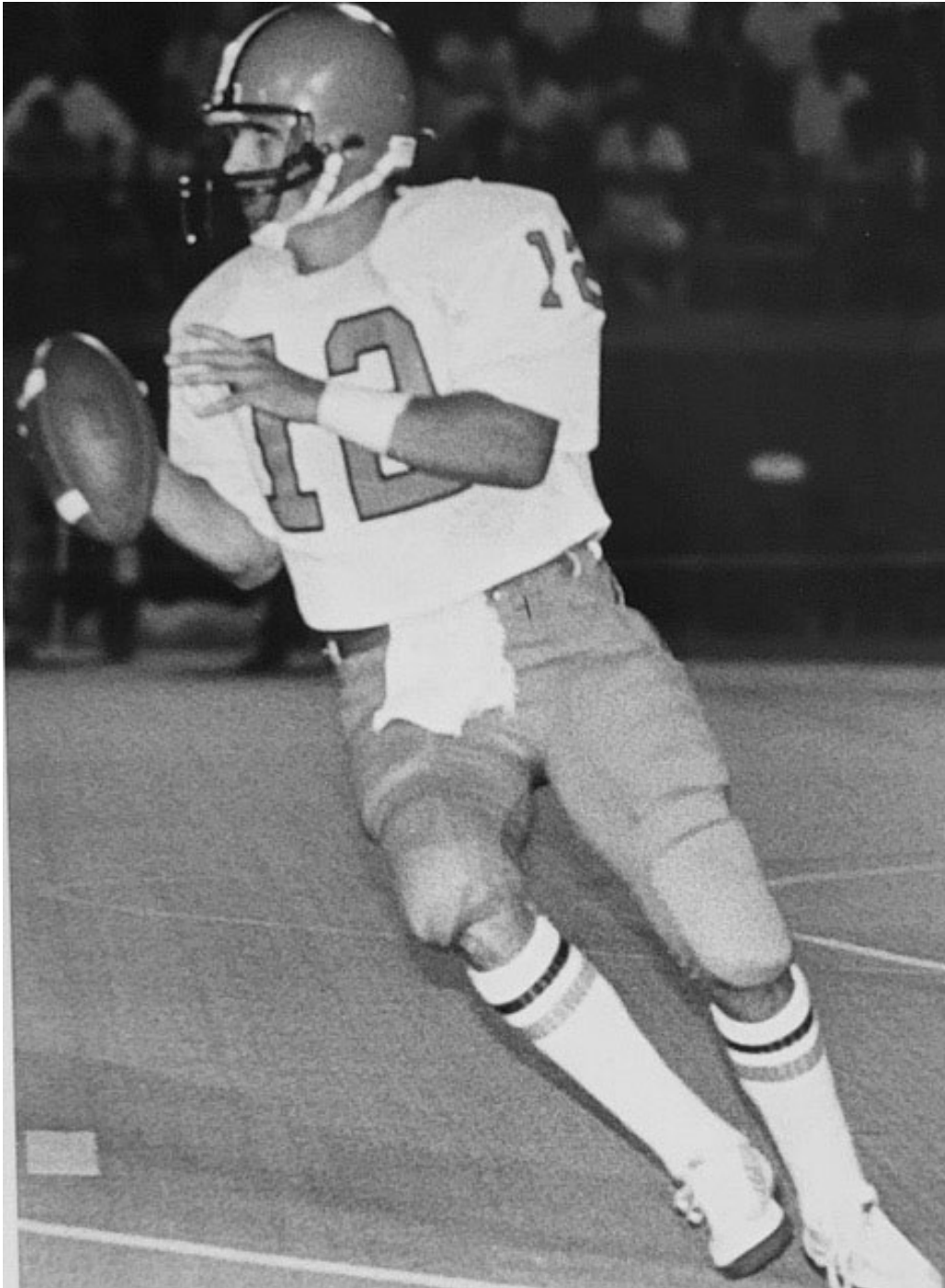

**Todd Norley
1982 Central Bucks West**

Todd Norley was a two-sport athlete who received 5 varsity letters during his Central Bucks West High School athletic career. He was a starting Guard for the varsity Basketball team and the leading scorer in his Junior year. In Football, he was a Defensive Back for three years and in his Senior year, he was the starting Quarterback and the team's Captain. The football team was undefeated and voted State Champions his junior year (1980) by various newspapers.

Todd was selected to play in the Big 33 All Star Game as a Quarterback. He was named the game's MVP and he led the East team to a 22 -21 Win, throwing 2 Touchdown passes, including the game winner.

Todd attended Syracuse University on a football scholarship in 1982. He was named the starting Quarterback in the fourth game of his Freshman year and received three Varsity letters. He would become the starting Quarterback the next three years and part of the most historic wins in Syracuse football history. In 1984 he led the team to the biggest upset victory against the #1 rated Nebraska Cornhuskers.

Todd graduated from Syracuse in 1986 with a degree in marketing and went on to be a leader in the commercial Real Estate field. He currently lives in Boston, Massachusetts with his wife, Doreen (who he met at CB West). He has three children and six grandchildren all living in the New England area.
